Dear Ms. Pellegrin:

This is in response to the subpoena which was served upon Prudential relative to the above-captioned case.

We were unable to find any record of contract GA-5524.

Enclosed is a 1 page excel chart detailing the 40 participants under contract GA-5523. This chart includes their home addresses.

Enclosed is an 80 page excel chart detailing the 1,411 participants currently receiving benefits under contract GA-5858. This chart includes their home addresses.

Enclosed is a 28 page excel chart detailing what information we have for the participants under contract GA-5858 who are not currently receiving benefits. We do not have their home addresses in our system. We only have their names and social security numbers. There are a total of 1,263 participants.

David Furlow had questioned whether there were more participants under ALR 5858 in addition to GA 5858. Let me explain: ALR is our Active Life Recordkeeping system, which is an extension of ABC. ALR is used to store, update, and retrieve information on participants who have not yet reached retirement. Participants can be in both ABC and ALR once they retire, so I think that is why they believe there are more lives than there actually are. They are counting the records in ALR and the retired lives on ABC as two separate lives, when in fact they are the same participants in both systems.
